Directions to Pauli's:

From the north, take HWY 20 to Rte. 91 in the town of Pompey. Turn south. You will encounter a 90 degree left turn followed shortly by another 0 degree right turn. Springside Farm is right after that on the left side.

From the south, take HWY 80 to Rte. 91 in Fabius. Turn north. Springside Farm is 2 or 3 miles up on the right. If you come to the 90 degree turn you went too far.
