When I transferred to Cornell, one of my part-time student jobs was taking care of a tiny flock of research sheep right there on campus, and that's where I fell in love (with sheep and Ed, although not at the same time, lol!).

Living on a farm gives you lots of latitude when it comes to animals, but not so much with time. I gave up all fiber arts for a long period. The sheep, the alpacas and the goats were one thing – time to sit and knit was another. I remember moving furniture around one day with my youngest daughter, then 19, and found my entire stash of knitting needles in the bottom of a drawer. "THERE they are! I thought I'd lost them!" She looked at me in amazement – "You know how to use those?" That was in 2004. I haven't stopped knitting since. Kids are grown, the farm has changed, and I can indulge, especially now that we are wintering in Florida. I am still getting used to the concept of "home" being in 2 places. Free time is such a luxury.
